### **MINISTRY OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STUDY**

The Ministry of Economic Development and Ministry of Transport have commissioned research that seeks to establish what the main economic connections are between the Auckland, Hamilton and Tauranga city-regions. This study will include analysis of labour market linkages, transport linkages and company linkages. Of primary interest to the AT&LG are the transport linkages and the effect that they have on development in the region. Final results are due early October.

### **CBAFF CONFERENCE 2010**

Terry Monaghan of Enterprising Manukau was invited to speak at the recent CBAFF conference on the top level results from the industry research study. This was an excellent opportunity to announce to delegates the establishment of the AT&LG, to promote the organisation to them and to call for their participation in the Group.
